MacDowell-MacDowall Country of Galloway

1. Corswall- a Campbell barony inherited by MacDowalls of Garthland in 1591.
2. Glen App- Where Alpin, King of the Scots was killed after a flight from northern Picts in 741.
3. Loch Ryan- Where Sir Dougal MacDougall of Gairochloyne (Garthland), Logan and Elrig defeated and captured Thomas and Alexander Bruce (brothers of Robert I) in 1307.
4. Garthland tower built in 1274 and pulled down c. 1840
5. Saulseat Abby founded by Fergus Lord of Galloway in 1160
6. Logan House (one the seat of the MacDoualls of Logan) and the location of famous botanical garden.
8. Glenluce Abbey founded by Roland, Lord of Galloway, in 1190.
9. Elrig- Granted to Dougal MacDougall by John I (Balliol) in 1295.
10. Machrimore Castle (Below Newton Stewart) seat of Macdowall of Machermore
11. Forest of Buchan where John of Lorn (5th Chief of Clan MacDougall) outflanked and almost captured Robert Bruce in 1307.
12. Kirrouchtrie- Site of decisive battle with Edward Bruce in 1308.
13. Cruggleton Castle- Seaside fortification of the Lords of Galloway and the Norse before them.
14. Whithorn Priory founded by Fergus, Lord of Galloway. Candida Casa established (c. 397) by Ninian, Scotland's first saint, is located on the Isle of Whithorn.
15. Palace Isle- Home of Fergus of Galloway on Loch Fergus near Kirkcudbright.
16. Buittle (Botel) Castle- Stonghold of the Lords of Galloway, Devorguilla and the Balliols.
17. Isle of Heston- Site of Sir Duncan Macdowall's stronghold, 1310-1353.
- 18 Sweetheart Abbey- Founded by Devorguilla (Balliol), Lady of Galloway, in 1273.
19. Dumfries: Where Robert I (Bruce) murdered John Comyn in 1306. Lincluden Abbey founded by Uchtred, Lord of Galloway 1161-5. Dumfries Castle starved into surrender by Robert I (Bruce) when held by Sir Dougal MacDougall in 1313.
